Unpublishing Policy

The Martlet sometimes receives requests to remove or unpublish our articles. This Unpublishing Policy is intended to address these requests.

All articles published by the Martlet Publishing Society are fact-checked and reviewed by multiple editors. After publication, the articles are archived in several ways. The physical newspapers are bound and archived at the end of each volume. Full PDF versions of the physical papers are uploaded online to issu.com. All articles are uploaded and exist on martlet.ca.

The Martlet's archives are a historical, public record. Unpublishing articles would mean altering and tailoring that record to fit specific agendas or requests. Therefore, the Martlet will only consider fully unpublishing articles that are possibly libelous, or have other legal ramifications.

The Martlet will consider changes to online articles depending on the circumstances of the request, our readership's right to know about its contents, the importance of the historical record, and fairness to those we have named. Changes may include removing personal information or photos, updating on facts, or deindexing the article. These changes will be considered in rare cases.
